

GOLF ETIQUETTE

- Pace of Play - keep up with the group in front of you. You should be able to play a 9-hole round of golf in a 2-hour time period
- Enter and Exit the fairways at designated stakes at each hole
- When teeing off or on the green, please remain quiet and still. Noise and movement are distractions to golfers
- Watch your partner's ball when they are hitting to help locate the ball quicker. You have no more than three minutes to look for a ball
- If unsure whether your ball is lost, play a provisional ball
- While the player furthest from the hole hits first, if they aren't ready, go ahead and hit your ball as long as it is safe to do so
- Drop off your partner with their club and drive to your ball (if safe) and be prepared to hit your next shot. Have a club ready!
- Be careful about hitting into the foursome in front of you. It could be dangerous if you hit too soon. Yell "FORE" if your ball is heading in the direction of another group or player
- A "WHIFF" of a ball does count as a stroke
- NO "gimmies" allowed when playing in the league
- If you hit the ball in the water or woods, let's say on your 2nd stroke, you count it as 2 in water/woods, 3 out, and next shot would be your 4th stroke
- Fix your divots and ball marks
- Rake the sand when leaving the sand trap
- After putting out, get everyone's scores and record them at the NEXT tee box
- GOLF GENIUS is available for scoring, and keeps things moving after the round
- If you see a golfer doing something incorrect, use kindness and tact in correcting their mistake. BE KIND. There are new and experience golfers in our league and everyone should show common courtesy
- When finished with your round of golf, go to the cart barn, total and verify scores. One person from each pair signs the score card. When a "shot gun" start bring only one card to dining room and when tee times bring one card into the Pro Shop
